

CITY COUNCILLORS COMMUNITY UPDATES

Cynthia Block City Councillor Ward 6



As I write this message, it is the beginning of August and I am so excited to be in our city. Saskatoon's summers have to be some of the best found anywhere. Add in festivals, music and outdoor patios, and it's just a glorious place to call home.

City Council is focused on reducing the proposed tax increase for 2020 and 2021. Initial projections of close to 4% are now closer to 3%. Especially in Ward 6, where our historic neighbourhoods have seen large increases in assessment, we need to find ways to reduce costs. I'm often asked what the city is doing to ensure tax dollars are used efficiently. In 2018, the city realized \$1.8 million dollars in savings. The Service, Savings & Sustainability Report is online at www.saskatoon.ca

At long last, we have a flood mitigation strategy in place to begin to address some of the worst flood-prone areas in the city. To make way for a dry pond in WW Ashley Park, a brand new soccer pitch is being constructed at Aden Bowman Collegiate. Regular soccer programming will continue at the new location, and the dry pond at the park will also be used for sports programming when it is completed in 2020.

Many areas in our ward had to deal with frozen water connections due to the extreme cold last winter. The City is increasing the number of machines to thaw connections, doubling the contractors on standby and creating a new plan to ensure better communication with residents.

Hello Queen Elizabeth/Exhibition residents,

Council has begun considerations of the Low Emissions Community Plan - a thirty-year roadmap to help Saskatoon meet our targets for community and corporate emissions reductions. This plan identifies possible initiatives that could be implemented to mitigate emissions in Saskatoon. Some of these initiatives – such as converting streetlights to LED bulbs – are already underway.

As Saskatoon prepares for continued growth, the 40 actions to reduce emissions, established in the LEC Plan, will result in social and economic benefits for the community. Improved health; additional jobs; reduced expenses for residents, businesses and the municipality; and improved quality of life, are ways the Low Emissions Community Plan incentivizes a more diverse and resilient economy.

A companion report to this plan is the Local Actions Adaptation Strategy, which identifies needs for infrastructure, policy and emergency response changes in order to position Saskatoon for resilience in the face of a changing climate. The next steps, should the report be approved by Council, include further consultation and engagement with the community and stakeholders to plan the implementation of the preliminary phases of work.

The annual **Dog Day of Summer** event is approaching quickly! This year's event will take place at Mayfair Outdoor Pool on Wednesday, August 28. Register your dog, by August 26, for a swim by visiting <u>saskatoon.ca/dogdayofsummer</u> and, please, note that dogs must be accompanied by an adult owner, vaccinated, licensed and well socialized in order to attend. The event will also include a fundraising BBQ for the SPCA, so bring your wallet!



Queen Elizabeth and Exhibition Neighbourhood Traffic Review

A Neighbourhood Traffic Plan for the Queen Elizabeth/Exhibition neighbourhoods was developed in consultation with the community in response to concerns such as speeding, traffic shortcutting, and pedestrian safety. The plan will be implemented over time as funding for the improvements is available.

The report of the General Manager, Transportation & Utilities Department dated April 16, 2018, was received as information.

Queen Elizabeth

Water Main Replacement

During the summer, the City's Queen Elizabeth neighbourhood Water Main Replacement project, including curb to curb resurfacing, roadwork and sidewalk repairs, was completed. The area affected was from Victoria to Eastlake Avenues on Adelaide and Ash Streets.

Hospice - 301 Hilliard

St. Paul's Hospital is opening the city's first free-standing residential hospice; a 15-bed communitybased facility, in the former Glengarda Residence at 301 Hilliard St. E. at Melrose Ave. It will look very different after the "demolition and addition" work is complete.





W.W. Ashley Park and Aden Bowman sports field redevelopment for flood mitigation

The City of Saskatoon is upgrading the storm water system to improve flood protection to residential and business properties near the 1st Street/ Dufferin Avenue and Taylor Street/ Broadway Avenue intersections. This will impact the multi-purpose sport field at W.W. Ashely District Park and some local roads during construction.
