June Community Meeting Highlights

St. Frances School Update

Superintendent of Education for the Greater Saskatoon Catholic School, Gord Martell, provided a PowerPoint presentation with statistics regarding this campus. He discussed the current situation and proposed relocation plans. A copy of the presentation is available on our website: qexca.ca/wp-content/uploads/2021/06/Martell-St.-Frances-June-1-2021.pdf). There are 502 students in grade 1 - 6 bused in from 57 neighbourhoods to the McPherson campus, with another 231 grade 7 - 9 students to the Bateman Ave. campus. The new school will be built at Grosvenor Ave. and 7th St., on the site of the Sion Middle School. he opening is planned for September 2023.

There have been no decisions made regarding the future of the existing St. Frances school building. That will be decided by the GSCS Board at a later date. QEXCA is concerned that the potential loss of the building could result in there being no publicly owned facility in the Exhibition neighbourhood. Theatre in the Park

There were to be two half-hour shows (5:30 and 7:30 p.m.) in the Queen Elizabeth School grounds. QEXCA agreed to a partnership with SUM Theatre which would provide volunteers, promotion and a donation for the production. The date was set for Friday, July 1. Unfortunately, the forecast high temperature for the day caused the presentation to be moved to only one 10:00 a.m. performance. The Weaver Park Cross-country Ski Trail was a hit this winter. Plans are in the works to operate it again this winter and, perhaps, with some programming.

<u>Schools</u>

Each of the five schools had good success navigating the pandemic restrictions, with physically-distanced graduation ceremonies. With many restrictions lifted plans are in place to welcome students, safely, back into the classrooms.

Churches

We now have a Liaison, Dawn Kellington, who is beginning to develop relationships with the nine churches in the community.

Community Gardens

This season will be much the same as last year. The Queen Elizabeth committee will continue with its maintenance and limited planting. The Aden Bowman crew will work under much reduced limitations. All the plots were taken very quickly, with three new gardeners. Funding from CHEP paid to replace some plots.

Library

The J. S. Wood Branch is planning to be returning to our normal, pre-Covid hours as of September 7 –1:00 to 9:00 p.m. Mon. to Fri., 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Sat. and 1:00 to 5:30 p.m. Sun. There will be some in-branch programming then as well, although they will continue offering virtual programming too. They have put back all of the furniture and the Library is open for studying and small group meetings.

W. W. Ashley Park Storm Pond

Our "Big Dig" – Many residents and businesses in low lying, older areas have been devastated multiple times by flooding where the storm water system does not have the capacity to adequately manage flash flooding. Streets in these higher-risk flood areas were not designed to convey storm water like they are now in newer neighbourhoods. The City of Saskatoon is upgrading the storm water system to improve flood protection to residential and business properties near the 1st Street/ Dufferin Avenue and Taylor Street/ Broadway Avenue intersections. Ruth Street Water Main Rehabilitation Project

The City of Saskatoon has begun infrastructure improvements on Ruth Street from Idylwyld Dr. to Broadway Ave. The work this construction season will include Water Main Lining, Water and Sewer Service Connection and Sidewalk Rehabilitation and Road Resurfacing. The work will take approximately 3 or 4 months to complete, weather permitting and barring unforeseen circumstances. Learn more on our website.


