Saskatoon Water is beginning to plan the third Flood Control project: potential construction of a dry storm pond on the north side of <u>Weaver Park</u> in 2023. If approved by City Council, the project will help mitigate flooding near the intersections at Dufferin Ave. and Cascade St. and at Dufferin Ave. and Bute St.

 The Weaver Park Trail was open again, this year. The City offered to groom the neighbourhood trails at no charge to the Communities. However, we do not feel that this was a satisfactory arrangement. The Weaver Park trail was groomed only once in three months; that was in mid-January. We have expressed our disappointment to the City.

7. Schools


- 7.1. **Aden Bowman** students and staff happy to be able to be participating in extracurriculars again.

wâhkôhtowin


