

#### Schools:

#### Aden Bowman

Enrolment as of November was 956. The senior boys football team placed second in the provincial finals. The band concert was very well attended as was the drama club's short plays production.

The SCC is working with the administration to bring Saskatchewan Industry Education Council mental health programs to the students and to parents.

Monique Rousseau (Karla Combres, School Liaison)

The elementary school is outgrowing its current location in the old Haultain School and officials are seeking a larger facility. Major repairs are needed to the roof and other areas of the current building. Senior elementary school students are already using space in the high school.

Queen Elizabeth (Lauren Wakelam, School Liaison)

Enrolment is down from last year. Some immigrant families are moving to larger centres and parents are opting for schools with full-day Kindergarten. This lower enrolment has resulted in reduced staff funding.

#### Riverside

We trust the new portable classrooms will improve learning environment for the staff and students.

St. Frances (Mike Pearce, School Liaison)

The big news, for this year, was breaking ground for the new facility. The new school is anticipated to open in the fall of 2025. Enrolment has increased from last year.

**Churches:** (Sherry Gore, Church Liaison)

Sherry has developed a strategy to contact each of the eleven (11) faith groups in our neighbourhoods to share news and events.

#### Community Gardens:

We'll check again in the spring.

The J.S. Wood Branch is offering Programs, including One-on-One Tech, Family Dance Party and Family Storytime, and a new "Notice Nature" program.

#### City of Saskatoon:

We learned that the Recommendations of the Exhibition Neighbourhood Local Area Plan and the Exhibition/Queen Elizabeth Neighbourhood Traffic Study have largely been implemented. The last few are awaiting funding, primarily Federal, in the next vear or two.

We will learn more about the Safety aspects of the Traffic Study at the March Community Association Meeting. Our relationship with our two City Councillors: Cynthia Block, Ward 6 and Mairin Loewen, Ward 7, has remained beneficial, with at least one of them attending Community Association Meetings.


#### **Weaver Park Update**

Most of the work on the Weaver Park Dry Storm Pond is complete: the excavation, storm sewer construction and infrastructure upgrades and the asphalt pathway construction. The only landscape construction left is some of the irrigation and sod installation, which will be done in the spring.

Newly sodded areas will remain closed to the public until the fall of 2024 for the sod to fully take root.

For the sidewalk rehabilitation work, the priority is to address all safety concerns, not aesthetics. This means that the City will use a variety of treatments and not all sidewalk panels will be replaced.
